OUR SCHOOL

Quest Alternative School is located on the third floor of Withrow Public School between Danforth Avenue and Gerrard Street. Quest Alternative has been in existence for 17 years.

- The school serves nearly 70 students, most of whom are of English-speaking backgrounds.
- Quest is an alternative school offering senior level (Grade 7-8) programs.
- The school shares the gymnasium, school yard, and library facilities with Withrow Public School, as well as the pool facilities with the City Adult Learning Centre.

Information about the success of our programs comes from a wide variety of student assessments. These assessments are based on clear expectations for all learners, consistent with those described in *The Ontario Curriculum*. The primary purpose of student assessment is to improve learning. Assessment has the greatest potential to improve learning when it is an integral part of classroom activities. Teachers assess student progress towards achieving the expectations on an ongoing basis by using strategies such as projects, class presentations, homework assignments, classroom observations, portfolios of student work, and tests.

Schools use assessment information and information from other sources to make informed decisions for school improvement planning. Schools identify areas of strength as well as areas that require improvement. Input is obtained from a variety of sources such as student assessments, teacher feedback, parent feedback, and community surveys. In this way, schools monitor, celebrate and improve their efforts in providing a supportive and challenging learning environment for all their students.

WHAT QUEST ALTERNATIVE SR SCHOOL IS PLANNING FOR THIS SCHOOL YEAR

School Focus For This School Year:

- Each fall Quest Alternative moves the school to Greenwood Conservation Area for a week to do field studies encompassing Science, History, Art, Language and Geography. The evenings are filled with social activities and parent visits.
- In January of each year, the students participate in five-day French immersion activities at St. Donat, Quebec.

In June of each year, the students participate in a fiveday camping experience – alternating between tent camping and hiking in Tobermory, Ontario, and an outdoor education programme at Camp Kandalore in Minden, Ontario.
